Discussion on membership/outreach:

- What is the advantage of membership?
- Do we need to rely on individual membership? Alternatives = sponsorship
- Need to give a feeling of belonging to a vibrant organization.
- Want to value add for the appreciation of folk music
- Need to find out what people want from the organization
- Build membership of clubs, performers

Radio

- Need to move away from Focus on Folk as the only radio program of the FF ideally, all folk radio should be identified as a FF program.
- Need to move to another station (Kate to address this issue)
- Bruce has a proposal re segments to offer to radio stations; podcasts
- Francis suggests having segments available via the website

Cornstalk (Chris)

- Folk Alliance made an offer to FF to combine newsletters, resources etc
- Trad & Now is now bi-monthly, sub price dropped substantially
- Post AGM, Chris emailed publisher re possibility of combining print resources
- Note that 80% of articles are from people in NSW (who are not offering articles to Cornstalk).
- Issues of Trad & Now would be offered to members for \$1.50 (we pay for mailing). We could reduce Cornstalk publication to 5 or 6 per year, or could look at not producing Cornstalk any more and combining with Trad & Now.
- Publisher of T&N wants to produce our contact list; would like to produce a aig guide.
- Given cost of Cornstalk & struggle to fill the issue with meaningful materials.
- Cttee to think about ramifications, talk to others, survey members?
- Comment sub to T&N is \$15pa. If Cornstalk is amalgamated with T&N, why
 would people pay \$25 to belong to FF?
- If we went that route, would need to ensure that there would always be provision for local info.
