### Member's News

Ellen and Taia, two of our members, recently trekked to Paddington for a Peggy Seeger workshop. This member of a famous musical family, and halfsister to Pete, is on a worldwide tour prior to taking up a teaching position at an American university. The workshop advertised was as "women's songs", but this was not the actual format.

For the first half, questions from the audience were invited and answered in word and song. The question that prompted the most interesting answer was "How do you develop a repertoire?". Peggy explained that singing for an audience was not the same as singing for yourself, as mixture of alternate fast, slow, funny, sad songs was needed to keep the audience from becoming bored. She then proceeded to demonstrate songs from each category different styles of in sinaina voice. Some of these singing styles were outside her comfort zone Appalachian eg. low traditional or very high British traditional styles and these would need to be thoroughly practiced

before taking to the stage. Following requests, the second half did consist of women's songs including Peggy's "Gonna Be An Engineer". She told stories of her childhood, of growing up in a musical family, her political activism, and her marriage to Ewan McColl (who wrote "The First Time Ever I Saw Your Face" for her). Taia and Ellen came home clutching autographed CDs and Ellen also had her rare and precious double audio tape of Peggy and Ewan from 1976 that Peggy also autographed.
